Progress with Action Plan:

Communities and Families Workstream Action 3: To work with NPFS representatives across the region to develop family/community learning and parental engagement.

Discussion around the West Partnership Action Plan 2019-22 identified key roles and actions for the West Partnership Parent Forum

- To identify practices that demonstrate schools, families and communities working together for all families with a focus on seeking to engage "seldom heard" parents
- To collate and share the common barriers that can result in "seldom heard" parents feeling disengaged. The National Parent Forum have developed a workshop that shares and reflects on potential barriers.
- To consider ways that interesting practice can be shared across the West Partnership so we can learn from one another. Potential methods were discussed:
 - Creating a network of shared practice on a digital platform that can be easily accessed by parents and practitioners - some storyboards have already been collected by the Communities and Families Workstream with a commitment to collect a further 24 over the next year (3 per authority)
 - Parent Forums and local authorities having access to a menu of presenters from across the West Partnership willing to share their interesting practice at locally organised events
 - Organising a larger event where parents and/or practitioners are invited to share and learn about interesting practice

Agreed Actions:

To focus on collating interesting practice by:

- 1. Helen will share a storyboard template that can be used for describing interesting practice
- 2. Helen will look through the already collected storyboards for examples of parental engagement themes
- 3. Helen will contact each local authority to collate examples of interesting practice in parental engagement (1 per authority)
- 4. All the NPFS chairpersons will share an example of interesting practice in parental engagement at the next meeting, using the storyboard format

Intended Impact: To develop a culture of families, communities and schools working together to improve outcomes for young people through the open sharing of interesting practice in parental engagement
