1. Level of knowledge on National Guidance in relation to assessment and moderation:

High/Very high	24%	59%

Post event majority of practitioners viewed their level of knowledge on the national guidance in relation to moderation as high or very high.

2. Knowledge of the moderation cycle

Some/Moderate	59%	38%
High/Very high	31%	62%

Post event majority of practitioners viewed their level of knowledge on the moderation cycle as high or very high



3. Understanding of moderation as a process.

Some/Moderate	66%	28%
High/Very high	29%	72%
